E1 Nature and Knowledge

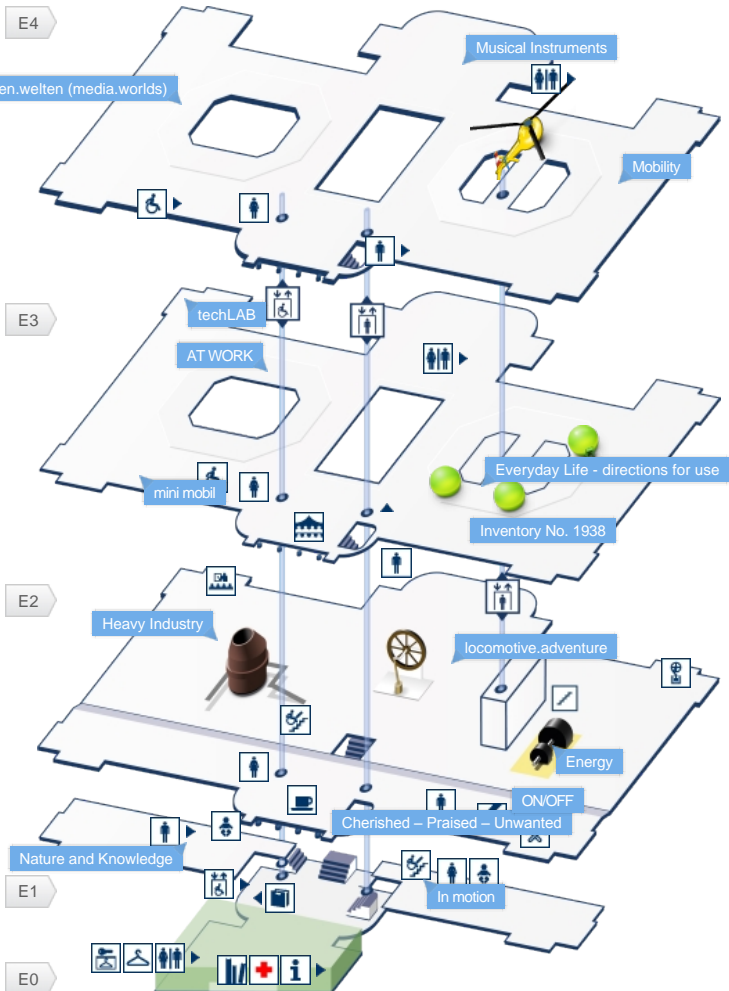
